### **Behaviour Policy**

Thank you for the responses to our recent survey about the rules you would like to see in Kingsford School. We really appreciate your input. We have been working hard as a staff over several sessions to begin looking at changes to be implemented and we will be sharing these with you before the summer holidays. Our Pupil Council has given pupils the chance to share their thoughts and opinions about the relationships in our school. They created their own survey and asked pupils in P4 to P7 to complete it. They also have plans to interview some younger pupils and staff members over the coming weeks. The children in the Pupil Council are thoroughly enjoying their role in this. Look out for further updates.

### **Lines System**

We introduced the children to a new lining up system and they are positive about it. In the morning the children, line up in one straight line for each class. They are met outside by their teacher or specialist teacher and brought into the school together.

At Break and Lunch times the children are no longer lining up and have a greater responsibility to enter the school building responsibly and safely, ensuring they are ready for more learning.

## No Gym Shoes

Children no longer need to change from outdoor shoes into gym shoes for the classroom. This is saving lots of time at the pegs and the children are in their classrooms more promptly when they enter the school.

A pair of gym shoes or trainers is required for P.E. as part of the gym kit.


## **WINNERS: Engineering** Extraordinaire
