Pupil Equity Funding is money that comes to our school to help us provide the best possible opportunities for children's learning.

In particular, it is there to help our school support children who experience barriers to learning and who might be falling behind or not getting the same chances in their education because their family is experiencing poverty or other financial difficulties.

This money is given to our school as part of the Scottish Government's Scottish Attainment Challenge. The Scottish Government wants to see every child succeed and achieve their full potential. That's why they have decided to give extra money to schools to help them to make education fairer.

Pupil Equity Funding is designed to support children in Primary 1 to S3 who are eligible and registered for free school meals. However, head teachers can use their judgment to support other children in their school who are affected by poverty.

For the past two sessions one initiative we have run at Kingsford is 'Getting Your Day Off To A Good Start'. All eligible children were invited at the start of each school session but not all of them took up their places and the spare places were used effectively by other children for other reasons.

However, moving forward into next session we have had to have a rethink as this initiative is not impacting on a large enough percentage of our eligible children. Currently those eligible families are participating in a survey and staff at school and ASG level have also been consulted as to our next steps.
